### Welcome and Introductions

# 3. Report to the Board

NW presented his activity report to the board which has been circulated to the Board.



#### Points of note:

- Eamon Hasoon started as the Engagement Officer on 1st March
- Failed to recruit a Volunteer Development and Training Officer for the second time NW has approached recruitment agencies but they are cost-prohibitive so will re-advertise.
- Rachel Wyness (Admin Support Officer) is leaving this week so role will be advertised.
- Making Safeguarding Personal has been met by some resistance NW wants to include FM in discussions.

Action: NW to invite FM to meeting on safeguarding.

# 4. Health and Care Bill, ICS

Briefing Paper on ICS White Paper has been circulated to the Board.

# Key points:

- The opportunities presented by the population level focus of the ICS and its prioritisation of place.
  - O There are possibilities for HWM to have an influence.
  - FM raised concern about impact on communities of interest and where they fit in when the focus is geographical.
- Representation by Healthwatch on the ICS Partnership Board (NHS Greater Manchester).
  - O The Board thought this should be a separate GM funded and supported post as there is a risk of burn-out if it is done in addition to the person's current role.
- The impact of the bill on local commissioning and procurement arrangements.
- Proposed changes to the CCG local engagement function.
  - Local engagement could be lost with HW potentially expected to fill gap
- Proposed changes to the regulatory powers of NHSE and 'joint committees'
  - O No joint committees with social care providers
- Lack of investment in the social care system.

Action: Include the ICS/White Paper as a standing agenda item for future meetings

### 5. Annual Priority Setting

Following consultation with the Board, Staff and Members, the below priorities were determined:

- The lack of dentist spaces and access
  - O Work is being taken forward at a GM level
- The impact of lockdown on people's health and wellbeing
  - O The Board decided that this was very broad so decided to narrow it to focus on young people and community mental health services
- The inclusion of local people in the design of NMGH site and other hospital services
  - O Keep the issue as a running brief but not for doing a piece of work on



- The barriers to health and care highlighted by lockdown
  - The board specifically highlighted a focus on the lack of access to face to face GP appointments and other health care services, and the impact of this
- The barriers to effective communication around health and care planning
- The lack of integration between housing and social care and the impact on health
- The COVID vaccine and other vaccine issues in Manchester
  - O HWM could help translating NHS comms into simple terms
  - O A focus on the disparities in vaccine uptake across ethnic groups

The priorities previously put on hold last year can be restarted/refocused:

- Discharge from prisons and access to health & care
  - O This is now being revisited
- CAMHS and access
  - O This can be linked to lockdown and impacts on mental health
